Black History Month

Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time recognizing central role of blacks in U.S. history. The event grew out of "Negro History Week," the brainchild of noted historian Carter G. Woodson and other African prominent Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating black history.

Origins of Black History Month

The story of Black History Month begins in 1915, half a century Thirteenth after

Amendment abolished slavery in the United States.

That September, the Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson and the prominent minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of Negro and Life History (ASNLH), an organization dedicated researching and promoting achievements by black Americans and other peoples of African descent.

Known today as the Association for the Study of African Life American and History (ASALH), sponsored group national Negro History week in 1926, choosing the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and

Frederick Douglass. The event inspired schools and communities nationwide to organize local celebrations, establish history clubs and host performances and lectures.

Black History Month 2018 Theme

Since 1976. everv American president has designated February as Black History Month and endorsed а specific theme.

The Black History Month 2018 theme, "African Americans in Times of War," marks the 100th anniversary of the end of World War I and honors the roles that black Americans have played in warfare, from the American Revolution to the present day.
